




(for National, State & Recognized Political Parties Only)




All National, State & Recognized Political Parties opting to contest an election with an election manifesto shall prepare all the 4 documents as mentioned above and submit them to EMP for approval.

# Finance Commission to prescribe limits on Expenditure (Section 78Y)


Article 280 (Indian Constitution)



Finance Commission constituted every 5 years by the

Hon'ble President <u>shall prescribe limits for different</u> <u>types of expenditure</u> for political parties to prepare

their Election Manifesto proposals accordingly.






Extent of Implementation of Manifesto Proposals

#### **Political Parties & Candidates**




Political parties and contesting candidates to <u>publicize</u>, <u>advertise</u> their EMs along-with Financial Outlay of schemes and other details <u>in a format prescribed</u> under <u>Election Manifesto</u> (<u>Regulation</u>) <u>Rules</u> subject to EMP's approval as applicable.

#### **Media Responsibility**



Responsibility of all forms of media i.e., Print / Electronic / Digital media to

- 1. <u>publicize</u>, <u>advertise</u> only approved EMs.
- 2.conduct public awareness programmes on contents of ALL Election Manifestos of all prominent political parties.



#### **Ban on Cash Handouts**

(Sections 123A & 126C)



#### Parties of the Incumbent Govt. CANNOT

announce any new cash-handout scheme of any kind targeting any particular class, group, category of individuals <u>six months prior to the date of polling</u> (<u>definitive or tentative</u>).
